
There are currently 82 universities in Spain, 50 public and 32 private.











Geographical distribution of active Spanish universities in the academic year 2019-2020.





Geographical distribution of **Bachelor's degrees** in the academic year 2019-2020.



Number of Master's degrees and students enrolled per brach of education.



Geographical distribution of PhD programmes in the academic year 2019-2020. Number of PhD degrees and students enrolled per branch of education.


























Coordinating bodies:

- Council of Universities (CU). Advisory, cooperation and coordination functions. It is made up of the Minister of Education, Culture and Sport and the rectors of public and private universities.
- General Conference on University Policy (CGPU). Coordination of general university policy. It is made up
 of the Minister for Education, Culture and Sport and the ministers with responsibility for higher
 education in the Autonomous Communities.










Coordination tools:

- Register of Universities, Centres and Degrees (RUCT). Official and public registers created to provide the most relevant information on the universities, centres and degrees that make up the Spanish university system.
- Spanish Framework for Higher Education Qualifications (MECES). Tool for international regulation and coordination that enable the classification, comparability and transparency of higher education qualifications in the Spanish education system.









National networks:

- Spanish Network of University Quality Assurance Agencies (REACU). It is made up of ANECA and all the regional quality assessment agencies of the university system. Promote and develop cooperation and exchange of experiences and information, especially methodologies and good practices.
- The University Commission for the Regulation of Monitoring and Accreditation (CURSA). Guarantees coordination in the implementation of the evaluation processes linked to the monitoring and accreditation of official degrees. It involves the Ministry, the Autonomous Communities, the quality agencies and the universities.













The National Agency for Quality Assessment and Accreditation of Spain (ANECA) is the body responsible for the evaluation, certification and accreditation of the Spanish university system with the aim of its continuous improvement and adaptation to the European Higher Education Area (EHEA).









ANECA aims to contribute to the improvement of the quality of the higher education system through the <u>evaluation</u>, <u>certification</u> and <u>accreditation</u> of teaching, teaching staff and institutions.



All ANECA evaluation programmes comply with the "Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area" (ESG)



ANECA: evaluation of university degrees





Co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union



Evaluates proposals for degree curricula designed in line with the EHEA.



Evaluates degrees for the award of International Quality Seals.



Performs an assessment for the renewal of the initial accreditation of official degrees.



Monitors the official degree to check its correct implementation and results.





ANECA: evaluation of university degrees





University degrees must undergo external evaluation processes by ANECA in different stages:

- In the first stage, prior to implementing the degree, ANECA, through the VERIFICA programme, evaluates the design of the degree (ex-ante accreditation).
- Once the degree has been implemented, in a second stage, ANECA monitors the development of the implementation through the MONITOR programme (monitoring).
- Once the degree have completed their implementation, in a third stage, they must undergo a cyclical process of accreditation renewal to maintain their status as an official degree. For this last phase, ANECA has developed the ACREDITA programme (ex-post accreditation).



ANECA: evaluation of university degrees







The Agency is taking a further step forward in its commitment to quality by offering, together with other institutions, the possibility of obtaining INTERNATIONAL SEALS OF QUALITY (SIC) of recognised prestige in various fields of knowledge and endorsed by international institutions.



ANECA: institutional evaluation








Helps universities to set up evaluation systems for their teaching staff.



Certifies the quality assurance systems of third country HE institutions.



Evaluates applications for institutional accreditation of university centres.





ANECA: institutional evaluation





- AUDIT: Guidance for Higher Education Institutions to establish their own internal quality assurance systems and certifies the design and implementation of those systems.
- DOCENTIA: Support for universities wishing to establish their own mechanisms to evaluate the quality of the teaching activity of their academic staff.
- ACREDITACION INSTITUCIONAL: Evaluation of applications for institutional accreditation of university centres.



ANECA: evaluation of teaching staff







Evaluates CVs of applicants for access to the positions of university lecturer under contract.



Evaluates CVs for access to university teaching bodies.



Evaluates the university research activities.



ANECA: evaluation of teaching staff





- PEP: Evaluation of the teaching and research activities as well as the academic backgrounds of future applicants to positions of non-civil servant academic staff (PhD Lecturer, PhD assistant Lecturer, Non-PhD assistant Lecturer and private universities Lecturer)
- ACADEMIA: Evaluation of the applicants' qualification to access the civil-service positions as university academic staff (Senior Lecturer and Professor) at the national level.
- CNEAL. Evaluation of the individual research activity of academic staff of the Spanish higher education institutions, at the national level.

- The Criteria and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the EHEA state that quality assurance agencies must be externally evaluated every 5 years.
- According to the external evaluation coordinated by ENQA, ANECA complies with the Quality Assurance Criteria in the EHEA.



ANECA: internal evaluation





The agency has designed and implemented a quality management system to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the services it provides to the university community.

- An *Internal Quality Assurance System (SGIC)* has been defined with the active involvement of all staff and with reference to the Criteria and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area.
- Quality and Strategic Planning Unit (UCYPE). Unit responsible for leading, in a cross-cutting manner, all processes related to internal quality assurance.



Spain: a decentralised model





- Spain is governed by a decentralised model of educational administration that distributes competences between the State, the Autonomous Communities and the universities.
- The state law includes the framework of competences of these three actors and allows the Autonomous Communities to develop their own laws on educational matters.









QA system in Castilla y León: ACSUCYL







The Quality Assurance Agency for the University System in Castilla y Leon (ACSUCYL) is the external assessment body for higher education in Castilla y León. Its mission is the quality assessment, accreditation and certification of universities in Castilla y León, as well as research and higher education centres, in the context of the European Higher Education Area.











- Promote improved teaching, research and management at universities and research centres, fostering enhanced competitiveness and economic development.
- Provide appropriate and suitable information concerning the higher education system to public authorities, the industrial sector and society as a whole to aid them when making decisions in their respective areas of action.



Quality Assessment Unit - USAL





- The USAL Quality Assessment Unit is responsible for providing technical support and methodological support to the definition and development of the Quality Improvement Programmes that affect the various institutional activities of the university.
- The Unit supervises compliance with the requirements set by the different national (ANECA), regional (ACSUCYL) and European (ENQA) quality assessment agencies, carrying out consultancy, advisory, information and coordination tasks in the assessment, accreditation and certification processes of the different units of the University: degrees, departments, institutes, centres and services.

Higher Education System in Spain





Main challenges facing the Higher Education System in Spain:

- 1. Making the legal framework more flexible
- 2. Coordinating sectoral and public administration policies
- 3. Improving inefficient organisational structures
- 4. Improving governance, transparency and funding
- b. Developing specialization
- 6. Improving the teaching model to promote employability, entrepreneurship and innovation
- 7. Increasing international competitiveness
- 8. Improving the social return on research, innovation and knowledge transfer
- 9. Encouraging talent attraction and retention
- 10. Deepening equity, social progress and inclusion







Main challenges facing ANECA:

- 1. Ensure that quality assessment criteria that Spanish universities apply tend to unify without losing sight of the regional reality and the process of European convergence.
- 2. Build an integrated education system.
- 3. Strengthen the presence in the international sphere.
- 4. Reduce the mismatch between the most demanded qualifications and those most in demand by employers.
- 5. Improve the levels of learning derived from university studies.
- Extend the culture of quality seals and certificates.
