



ESG 2.4 The involvement of international experts in external QA, for example as members of peer panels, is desirable as it adds a further dimension to the development and implementation of the processes.

ADVANTAGES OF INTERNATIONAL QA

- Avoiding conflicts of interests increased objectivity of the process
- Evaluation with the European perspective
- Possibility to find experts of specific areas
- High quality of experts
- Especially important for joint study programmes
- Recommendations for improvement of national external quality assurance framework

ADVANTAGES OF INTERNATIONAL QA

Experts – lecturers for trainings, presenters at the conferences and seminars
 Advices for improvement of procedures
 Advices on political issues (general overview and recommendations to national authorities; meetings at the ministry)

BENEFITS FOR HEIS

Valuable recommendations for improvement

- Open perspectives through the discovery of means and solutions used in other European countries
- Useful contacts
- Evaluation by SKVC funded by the state

CHALLENGES OF INTERNATIONAL QA

- Lack of knowledge of the national HE system
- Cultural differences
- Translation time and quality
- High financial costs
- Trainings only on the first day of the visit or on-line
- Organization of the visit more complicated
- Burden for HEIs all documentation in ENG



- Evaluation of joint study programmes (JOQAR project & scheduled evaluations by SKVC)
- Accreditation of study programmes evaluated by foreign agency in one of state universities

CONCLUSIONS

- O Cooperation of foreign agency with the national QAA
- Review of the evaluation report and suggestion for accreditation by the Board of the national QAA – assurance of equal conditions
- QA should take into account national priorities and context
- Involvement of experts from different HE systems valuable practice


Institutional review in Lithuania: results of the first cycle of institutional review

I cycle of reviews


Begining in 2011

- All decisions on accreditation by Spring 2015
- Repeated review 2015-2018

Consequences of review




Review results




Accreditation for 6 yearsAccreditation for 3 years

Negatively evaluate areas






HEIs were provided with the lists of good practices: <400 (9 per institution)

Experts



Changes during the process

- Mandatory consultations for HEIS before submitting selfevaluation documents;
- □ Introduction of the mapping tool for experts;
- Recommendations for HEIs on preparation of self-evaluation documents (published online);
- Summary of the review report for wider public;
- Review of Priests Academies by AVEPRO (starting from November 2014).

Appeals

During the I cycle:

4 appeals
1 case in Court (duration - 2,5 year)
